



## Chum Creek BNT Expeditions

### 1. Overview

Chum Creek Horse Rides offer a range of Horse Riding, Bicycle, Bush Walking Expeditions on the Bicentennial National Trail (BNT), which stretches from Healesville in Victoria to Cooktown in tropical far north Queensland.

Conveniently located at the southern end of the iconic 5,330 kilometre BNT, we embark on the BNT Trail and your adventure begins!

Our Horse Riding Expeditions are fully supported and provide everything you need; Backup four-wheel drive vehicles; horses and gear; accommodation and great food.

We operate small groups, supported by an experienced team, ensuring a safe and memorable Expedition.

Experienced trail guides and bushman with extensive BNT backgrounds in the Australian bush and the Victorian High Country will enhance your Expedition by sharing their bush skills and horsemanship along the way.

### 2. Who operates Chum Creek BNT Expeditions

Clancy Lewis is the principal of Chum Creek BNT Expeditions. Clancy is also a Board Member of the BNT Board, that is a not-for-profit Board tasked with ensuring the sustainability of the BNT.

through some of Australia's wildest, most inaccessible country. You will be enthralled by the unsurpassed views, the wilderness valleys and the excitement of the pioneering spirit.

## 7. Frequently Asked Questions

### 7.1 How do I get there?

Chum Creek BNT Expeditions can arrange pick-up and drop-off to the nearest local transport drop-off / accommodation for our customers as part of our service. We also arrange transfers to the start and finish locations of each expedition.

**Air** – Chum Creek / Healesville is approximately 1 hours drive from Melbourne International Airport (Tullamarine). This airport is Australia’s second busiest airport with hundreds of flights daily.

A Taxi fare from Melbourne International Airport (Tullamarine) to Chum Creek / Healesville costs approximately AU \$150.

Healesville have approximately various 200 accommodation rooms options.

**Rail** – Lilydale metropolitan railway station is approximately a 1 hour train ride from Melbourne CBD, with trains leaving approximately every 40 minutes. The CCBNT provides a courtesy pick-up and drop-off service from Lilydale Railway Station for CCBNT HRE customers.



## **7.2 Where can I stay the night before we begin our expedition?**

It's a good idea to stay nearby the night prior to your expedition so that we can leave in the morning with plenty of time to reach our destination.

Recommendations for overnight stays include;

- Cabin Accommodation at Chum Creek Horse Riding and Huts, in Chum Creek. (Where Clancy lives).
- Accommodation at nearby Healesville. Healesville has approximately various 200 accommodation rooms options.

We can give you our recommendations for accommodation in the town closest to our departure point.

## **7.3 What is the overnight accommodation whilst on the BNT Expeditions?**

Accommodation varies on a nightly basis depending of the physical location of the expedition for that night. When camping out on the BNT, we use tents or swags.

Our staff will arrive at each campsite before you arrive to begin to prepare for camp. There will always be a helper to ensure you go to bed warm, well fed and ready for the next day.

## **7.4 What type of weather can we expect?**

From the southern end of the BNT we enter directly into Victoria's High Country. Expeditions are carefully scheduled to ensure optimal timing to account for Australia's seasonal weather.

We offer expeditions throughout the southern summer, from November to March, however weather in the Australian High Country can be very unpredictable. Temperatures may range up to mid-30 degrees celsius during the day to below 10 degrees celsius overnight. You may even experience snow!

### **7.5 How many kilometres or hours will we be travelling each day?**

We usually cover on average 18 kms per day. This pace has been found to allow riders time to enjoy the landscape and to soak in the atmosphere of the BNT. Time in the saddle each day does vary depending on the terrain and distances between camping spots or accommodation.

### **7.6 What if I want a break?**

There is usually a four wheel drive back-up vehicle that meets us at nominated points daily. This provides opportunities to have a break in the vehicle to rest parts of your body that are not used to riding.

Note, however that the back vehicle does not usually follow the horses continually throughout each day. We want to ensure that you enjoy the tranquillity of the Australian High Country and the bush without the distractions of civilisation.

### **7.7 Will mobile/cell phones work?**

Mobile/cell phone reception is scattered in the country we ride in. Even so, consider turning off your phone for the expedition.

As part of our risk management process, the Chum Creek BNT team carry telecommunication systems to be used in emergencies.

### **7.8 What is the food like?**

Our staff will be using camp ovens, grills and hot coals to create wonderful tasty and filling meals. Dietary requirements will be met wherever possible. When in towns, we choose excellent catering options close to our accommodation, but can book your table at an alternative establishment upon request.

### **7.9 What is included in the price?**

Experienced, knowledgeable guides  
All group camping equipment  
All meals and accommodation as per the itinerary  
Horses and saddlery  
Helmets and oilskin coats  
First aid and emergency communications  
Four-wheel drive backup, including luggage transport.  
Courtesy pick up from Lilydale Railway Station if required.  
Secure parking for your vehicles at Chum Creek, during the trip

You will also receive a one year BNT membership and a BNT Section 12 guidebook to help you relive your trip.

### **7.10 Do I need any special equipment or camping gear?**

All camping gear is provided, including tents, swags, sleeping bag, mattress, kitchen, and all group camping equipment. If you would like to bring your own sleeping bag make sure it is suitable to alpine conditions.

### **7.11 What to bring**

You should consider bringing;

- Swimmers
- Long pants and shirts for riding (and maybe even stockings for under your legs – yes for both women and men!)
- Cold weather sleeping bag
- Riding boots
- Towel
- Alcohol
- Spending money
- Sense of adventure and humour

### **7.12 Costs**

Chum Creek BNT charge a flat AU\$450 per person per day. (Plus Goods and Service Tax (10% GST))

### **7.13 What if I have to cancel my booking?**

We operate on a first-come-first-served basis with each booking secured and confirmed on full payment. Each expedition has a minimum and maximum numbers of trekkers on each expedition.

Chum Creek BNT endeavour to schedule BNT Expeditions in a consecutive manner to allow customers to continue their expedition where they left off.

We can and do schedule additional and customised BNT expeditions as demand requires.

If you cancel, we will refund you 80% of the price of the booked expedition, or credit you the full amount on other Chum Creek BNT Expeditions or Chum Creek Horse Trail Rides.



#### **7.14 How do I book and pay?**

All bookings and payment are to be paid prior by the online payment facility on the Chum Creek Horse Rides website – [www.chumcreek.net.au](http://www.chumcreek.net.au). Go to BNT Expedition page.

Clancy also asks that all trekkers to personally call him to discuss the expedition and any personal requirements you may have. +61 407 326 276.

Please note that not all rides are listed online, so if you have something specific in mind give Clancy a call to discuss +61 407 326 276.

#### **7.15 Can I lay-by my Chum Creek BNT Expedition or purchase a Gift Voucher?**

Chum Creek BNT Expeditions have limited numbers and availability per expedition, therefore we require a 20% deposit to secure a booking, with final payment due 60 days prior to expedition departure date. Availability is on a first-come-first-served basis. So if your balance is not paid within 60 days prior to your expedition departure date, then there is a high chance your spot will be taken and your deposit will be refunded in full back to you.

Chum Creek also Gift Vouchers to be used on all of Chum Creek offerings; BNT Expeditions, shorter horse trail rides and accommodation.

#### **7.16 Riding Advice**

#### **7.17 Does Chum Creek cater for someone who has never ridden?**

Our horse trail rides and BNT Expeditions are suited to all levels of rider experience.

However, we highly recommend that for those that have not ridden before they do a few shorter horse trail rides or riding lessons in the months beforehand, but that is not essential.

Many of our riders are first-time / novices. Our team take care in our pre-expedition briefings to equip riders with the basic skills of managing their horse and are always available to you if you need assistance or advice. We take great efforts to match you to your horse.

**7.18 I have not ridden a horse in many years, will I be okay to do a long ride?**

We ride at a fast walking pace during the day, with opportunities to go faster in appropriate locations. The distance we travel averages between 15 to 27 kilometres a day (averaging approximately 18 kilometres per day), with a lunch break and other chances to hop off for a stretch. We suggest you would need to have a moderate level of fitness.

**7.19 Do you have different rides available depending on experience?**

Chum Creek Horse Rides & Huts offer a range of horse trail rides including:

- 1 hour horse trail rides
- 2 hour horse trail rides
- 1 day Yarra Valley Winery horse trail rides
- 1 day Yarra Valley Pub horse trail rides

**7.20 What is the youngest age you take on overnight rides?**

On our BNT Expeditions, our minimum age is 18. However, in some instances, such as a family booking, trekkers from 15 years will be considered. If the rider is under 18 years old, it is essential that an adult or guardian accompany the child.

**7.21 Why do you ask my height and weight when I book for a ride?**

Each rider's riding ability, size and confidence is considered when choosing an appropriate horse and saddle.

**7.22 Do you have a weight limit for riders?**

Yes, if you are above 95kg we will need to assess your height and weight ratio to consider if you will be suitable to participate in longer horse trail riding expeditions. We reserve the right to refuse anybody that does not meet our weight restrictions.



### **7.23 Are there showers and toilets on the overnight rides?**

Our team set up a toilet and privacy screen of an evening with access to soap and a hand wash basin. Depending on the particular overnight location, we may not provide a portable shower, however there are some opportunities to jump in creeks for a High Country bath!

### **7.24 Do we have to horse ride in order to come on an overnight expedition? Can I ride a bicycle or walk?**

We welcome non-riding customers to come on our expeditions. We ride and camp in some very special places that you may never go to again. Bicycle riders and walkers can come on Chum Creek BNT Expeditions. Non-riding/walking trekkers can also accompany the expedition in the back-up four wheel drive vehicles, still having the opportunity to see great scenery at a leisurely pace and arriving early at each night's camp, ready to relax and greet the riders on their arrival.

### **7.25 Can I bring my own horse or bike?**

Yes - you can take your own horse (other than full or part thoroughbred horses), or bike. Prior arrangements will be managed if you bring your own horse. This can be discussed with Clancy by phone before a booking is made. The price per person per day \$450, is the same with your own horse or bike.
